Report of the Senior Pastor Pastor Leland Lantz

Dear Friends in Christ,

For such a time as this... it is a privilege to serve with you as fellow evangelists of the Gospel and the Great Commission as we live out our mission to **"Know, Grow, Go and Sow."**

As your spiritual director, it is always good to pause and look back to see where we've been and to see where we are and then to look forward. Back on the farm, in the days of cultivating crops, I could easily plow a wrong set of rows and if I didn't take a moment to look back, I might find I had plowed out a whole row or more of crops I didn't intend to plow without even realizing it! So it is in ministry, we need to look back periodically to see where progress or mistakes are made and then plow forward and adjust to the challenges before us.



The Importance of God's Word

An important hallmark and mission of LCC is the importance of God's Word. Our mission is to "know" the Word of God and apply it to our lives. A special 'thank you' to everyone who teaches, leads, and participates in studying God's Word, as we have had consistent growth and participation this past year. My goal is for everyone to be in God's Word in a weekly study or group setting that focuses on learning and applying God's teaching to daily living.

Creating Discipleship and Spiritual Growth

There will be expanded opportunities for everyone to be in God's Word as we creatively bring more options to LCC and our community. Let us be reminded that our Aliso Viejo Christian School and our LCC Preschool were born out of our Lutheran heritage that constantly brings us to focus on knowing God's Word. We are lifelong learners as *A Christian Community For All Generations*.

We Have Been Blessed With Many Opportunities to Serve

Caring for Seniors in Need

God has given us opportunities to welcome people with diverse backgrounds to our Laguna Woods campus to receive physical food. In the past 12 months, we've hosted an average of 150 people for the Senior Grocery Program. An average of 26 volunteers work each distribution event, which makes this program a huge success. The Food Box Program averages 80 people. Our Laguna Woods campus is located in a retirement community and we find there is a great need for food support in these "golden years" as more people are living longer, while facing the challenges and stresses of making ends meet on fixed incomes. These programs foster an increased utilization of volunteers from our church and other faith communities around us. These programs also help us show our community that we care with the love of Christ, and gives us opportunities to invite people to come and worship with us. My hope is for all of us together to live out the Great Commission.

We Are Blessed With Generosity

A special note for this year has been the blessings of bequests (special gifts received through people remembering our church in their wills). These gifts have allowed us to:

- · Maintain and improve our facilities
- Improve our programs
- · Promote campus safety
- · And most importantly to share the Gospel.

Nearly all improvements have been provided outside of our regular tithes and offerings budget.

However, We Still Have Much To Do

Attendance and Participation

As we look back across the past 10 years, we continue to face ongoing challenges of attendance and giving. We continue to monitor attendance in all areas of ministry. Attendance trends around the world indicate that people now believe "regular attendance" means worshiping one and a half times a month or 19 times every year. We will continue to work at reversing this trend. This year we received 74 new members.

48 adults and 11 Kids. I pray we can double this amount next year.














Class & Group Weekly Attendance

- With all the changes we have experienced a loss in attendance, and we will be working to grow this campus ministry again in the coming year.
- We have initiated the process of calling a Campus Pastor who will focus on youth and family ministries and our Aliso Viejo Christian School, with an emphasis on Church/School integration. I ask for and need input and involvement from you as we move forward.

Growing our Youth Program

- Our youth program, consisting of middle school and high school families, has historically cycled in size and scope.
- My goal this year is to prioritize building a solid youth program that will be sustainable and beneficial to families in the community.
- · We look forward to building up youth and family ministries at both campuses.

We are devoted to increasing our visibility and interaction with our school and surrounding community, and overall, we are seeking to grow God's Kingdom here in Aliso Viejo.

Raised the Visibility of the Church at Aliso Viejo

Since 1999, church members have met for worship at the Aliso Viejo campus in what was originally the first gym, named the "multi-purpose room." This year, through a generous gift from Dottie Marconi's estate, we did some remodeling and created a formal sanctuary for both the church and Aliso Viejo Christian School. This "new" sanctuary clearly shows we have both a church and school at this campus. We dedicated the sanctuary on December 16, 2019.

Built a Stronger Relationship Between School and Church

There is no getting around the fact that we have approximately 320 kids here at school Monday through Friday. They all have parents who are passionately involved with the school and this year we have all made a significant effort to be more visible and integrated in the school's activities. This includes weekly chapel services, both dramatic and musical performances, and even serving as the "designated pitcher" for both teams in the annual Eighth Graders vs. Faculty softball game.

Created a Culture of Invitation at Aliso Viejo

While we experienced a drop in attendance when Pastor John left, we have been busy since improving how we interact with visitors and the surrounding community. We stream our worship on 'Facebook Live' every Sunday. We have increased our volunteers to better cover the essentials of ushers, greeters, lectors, and altar guild. We have focused on our worship service, bringing back more of our Lutheran Liturgical service elements, and providing more consistent music leadership. Attendance numbers have been slowly climbing, and for this we thank our God for He is good.

We are truly and abundantly blessed!

For us who chose Lutheran Church of The Cross as our home in Christ, we have virtually unlimited opportunities to be grateful. Our congregation is filled to the brim with servant hearts and hands for nearly every facet of life, both within and beyond the doors of our church campuses and schools.

A Year of Change

In the last 12 months, we have undergone many changes and together, as council, staff, volunteers and congregants, we have used the unexpected as a springboard for a stronger future. With Pastor John's departure last summer, came an opportunity for us to pause and take a fresh look at where we are as a church, what we want LCC to be, and how we are going to get there.

Building a Vision for our Future

This last year, we began work on defining a strategic vision for 5 years, 10 years, even 20 years from now, as we follow God's plan for us under the spiritual leadership and guidance from our pastors. Taking this long-range perspective is essential for LCC's viability, continuity and growth into the future. While we have just begun this process for the future, we were able to identify and take action on a number of items essential to any future we can envision.



- **Upgraded Our Aliso Viejo Campus:** Aliso Viejo's multi-purpose room has been transformed to become a formal sanctuary.
- Formed a Call Committee: We started with reviewing and writing a new role description for our future Campus Pastor at Aliso Viejo. We are currently posting the role with organizations and are accepting resumes. We are looking for a pastor dedicated to the creation and leadership of a vibrant, irresistible ministry focused on families, children and youth.
- Updated Our IT/Technical Infrastructure: Over the years, we had become woefully behind in our IT abilities. This year we made significant updates to provide an effective and efficient work environment from which to serve. This included a high-speed WIFI, a new phone system, and upgraded audio/visual equipment.
- Focused on Creating Safe Schools and Campuses: To better preserve safety on our campuses, we have initiated several specific projects to upgrade and make our facilities more secure. This includes perimeter fencing, security locks, physical barriers, and an overall safety plan.
- Facilitated Financial Peace for Our Members: This past spring we sponsored a class on financial health based on Biblical principles with a goal to help our members and the community. We chose the Dave Ramsey Financial Peace University course resulting in very enthusiastic and positive feedback. Look for more to come!

A Thank You to Our Staff and Volunteers

On behalf of the congregation as a whole, I extend a heartfelt thanks to our awesome leadership staff and to the volunteer leaders of LCC. Our leaders contributed countless hours to make this last year productive and meaningful toward establishing a firm foundation upon which LCC can serve His Kingdom for many years to come.












Wednesday Night Attendance (Weekly Average)

Kids4Jesus

Our Kids4Jesus programs are offered several days a week with fun, Christ-centered activities. In the summer, we offer two Vacation Bible School programs - One for preschoolers and another for Junior Kindergarten through 5th grade. We divide the age groups so we can offer a more focused curriculum and a better attention ratio to the children.



Youth4Jesus

Our Youth4Jesus program divides meetings up for middle school vs. high school ages. Middle school age kids meet weekly, plus once a month, we do a fun and exciting event that we call "Big Bash Events." The name says it all! For high school teens, we meet Sunday evenings at various locations for more outrageous fun.



American Heritage Girls Troop CA2517

This is an outside ministry that connects our church to the surrounding community. The group volunteers at multiple church and community events. While the troop is external, we play an integral role in its success. We are proud of what we have accomplished in this fantastic program. We also are seeking to start a Trail Life troop, a similar program for boys.

Visitations and Special Ministries Report Pastor Ron Michelson



Ministering to our Homebound Members

As Pastor of Visitation Ministries, I oversee and lead a team of deacons who visit the homebound and are trained to bring communion when they visit. Our goal is to visit each homebound member once a month. This past year the number of deacons has increased by seven, bringing our total team to 14 deacons. The number of homebound members has also grown to 44. The homebound list is ever changing as some members get better and are able to come to church, while others are added when their health needs change.

Stephen Ministry

Our Stephen Ministry is a one-on-one, laycaring ministry, which I help lead. This ministry is making an impact in the lives of "care receiver" members of our congregation. Our Stephen ministers care for members going through emotional, physical and spiritual difficulties such as grieving the loss of a loved one, and/or the loss of a job or facing a difficult life transition. This ministry was developed in our church by Cindy Gaw, the Director and Referrals Coordinator, with the help of Val Draskovich, Supervision and Training Coordinator and Kerri Harris, Communications Coordinator. Continuing Education is led by these leaders and augments the 50+ hours of training to become a Stephen Minister.

Lutheran Bethesda Care Homes Ministry

On behalf of our congregation, I also lead and host a weekly caring ministry to eleven Lutheran Bethesda Care Homes for the developmentally and/or physically challenged. The residents and their staff come to our LW social hall every Tuesday to have a meal, hear a Bible lesson, sing, do craft projects and to pray. It is a time of "engagement" they would not otherwise experience. Valerie Ellis prepares meals geared just for them with the help of volunteers such as Greg Ellis, Myrna Nelson, Bill Thomas and Norma Willoughby. Additional volunteers who help in this ministry include: Charlotte Galambos, Michael Gerendas, Millie Graham, Teri Judd, Greg McNelley, Herma Parker-Jones, Jan Petereit, Irene Romero, Christine Stanton, Keith Venia, Gene Yamauchi and Janice Yost.



Teaching the Bible from a Messianic Perspective

I teach weekly, in-depth examinations of God's Word from a Messianic perspective and its life applications. This past year we studied the Book of Nehemiah and the Book of Philippians. I also teach a weekly Bible Study at Freedom Village, a senior living facility, every Monday at 10 am.

Men of Integrity

I also lead a weekly men's group, "Men of Integrity." We meet every Saturday morning at 7:00 am. Our purpose is to ignite, equip, and unite men to keep their promises as they live their faith in their families, at work, and as members of LCC.

Operations and Facilities Report Kevin Murphy

As Director of Operations, I oversee operations for the church and both of our schools. Under the "operations" definition, thus, includes finance and budget management, facilities, IT, human resources and communications. This role was developed to free our church and school leadership from the tactical duties of managing logistics.

In my first three years we have conquered many large projects that have helped to close the gaps we had in capabilities and compliance.

Some of the highpoints for this year were:

Financial Management

Fine-tuned our forecasting analysis to get a truer financial picture of how the entire organization is performing out 12 months.


- · Developed a five year financial plan for church and schools.
- Conducted our first bona fide audit with an outside team to meet church constitution requirements and ACSI school requirements. Developed 25 different schedules to give the auditors. Audit results were favorable with no material issues.
- Cleaned up Balance Sheet to eliminate unnecessary accounts and make financials more straightforward.
- Reduced man-hours counting weekly offerings by incorporating new technology.
- Performed internal audit reviews of ARK program and student store at AVCS, implementing process improvements for both programs.

Operational Measures, Cost Containment and Efficiency


Reviewed our IT environment and support; initiated new vendor relationship that supports both the church and schools.

- Moved training for sexual harassment and other management courses to online course, saving on outside vendor costs.
- Participated in leadership role with school consortium that aids schools on training topics to improve bottom line and procedures.
- Developed new PTO (Paid Time Off) policy for organization.
- Managed state Grant Aid process.
- · Reviewed janitorial services for church saving 30% in overall cost.
- · Reviewed and contracted with new human resources consultancy
- · Continue to reduce Accounts Receivable balances for unpaid tuition for AVCS.





We have been regularly live streaming the worship service from Aliso Viejo's 9:45 am service and have seen a significant growth over time in reach. We will soon begin live streaming Laguna Woods services in the coming year. This will prove to be a strong tool for homebound and members who are not local.

Video Production

Our ability to shoot and edit videos is getting stronger. We have found that videos are better for getting attention and conveying a message than static images. We archive all of our videos on our YouTube Channel, where everyone can watch and share them. This next year we anticipate the construction of a video studio (as part of The Cove LW renovation) where we can record both video and audio.

LCC Preschool

We have worked closely with the LCC Preschool in establishing a strong "lead generation" program where prospective parents can request a tour online, both on Facebook and on the website. This has proven to be the strongest form of new student enrollment. The LCC Preschool has turned around having a shrinking enrollment into a growing enrollment, prompting us to add full days and summer programs.

Advertising

In the last year, we have conducted outside advertising for special events, as well as around the holidays, to help lift our visitor rate. We have focused on five cities specifically: Laguna Woods, Laguna Hills, Lake Forest, Aliso Viejo and Laguna Niguel.

It is such a blessing to be part of the ministry of Lutheran Church of the Cross, being located on campus and being able to interact daily in this multi-generational environment. Over the past few years, our preschool was experiencing a decreasing enrollment; however, I am happy to report that this has been a year of solid growth with our enrollment expanding to a new high of 79 children.

Our Culture is What Makes Us Different

The Gospel is shared with the preschool children and their families. Each staff member is a faithful servant of the Lord and a reflection of His love and faithfulness.

Jesus' love for each child is reinforced and the fruit of the Spirit permeates our preschool environment.

This year our students had the following opportunities to share His love with others in need locally and around the world:

- Nearly 20 shoeboxes were given by preschool families for Operation Christmas Child through Samaritan's Purse
- · 24 gifts were donated to the Laguna Woods Fire Department for their Spark of Love Christmas Toy Drive.
- February Love Offering donations totaled just over \$1500 (\$900 was donated by one family to go toward Samaritan's Purse Clean Water Projects and the remaining provided seven dairy goats and eight dozen chickens to families in need through Samaritan's Purse.) Praise God!
- We partnered with Our Father's Table again by participating in a PB & J Drive as an outreach to those experiencing homelessness. In October, over 60 units of peanut butter, jelly and sandwich baggies were donated; in April, an additional three bins were collected.
- Our kids sang at the South County Senior Day Center (17 students participated) and at other LCC events, including the 85 & Better Luncheon and a Saturday night worship service at the LW campus.

A Focus on Teaching

Our curriculum is taught from a Christian worldview. This year Captain Carl's Mobile Tidepool visited our school for a hands-on experience and to teach about how God created each tide pool animal uniquely. We had a special Wheel's Day (Transportation) and International Day (Multicultural month), as well as Pancake & Pajama Day, Crazy Sock Day and many other fun activities.

For the first time, the preschool offered a full day class (7:45 a.m.-5:45 p.m.), in addition to our traditional half day program (8:45-11:45 a.m.), plus an extended day class (8:45 a.m.-3 p.m.). We had 16 students who stayed extended /full day on MWF and 13 students on TU/TH. We are also offering 10 weeks of summer school

Missions Committee Tracey Awwad & Geri Robinson

We are blessed to be a part of bringing Christ in various settings, ranging from enriching and growing the existing congregations of a church, to new church planting, to spreading the gospel through the airwaves, to support for Christian orphanages, and to Bible translation in foreign languages. During the fiscal year 2018-2019, the church maintained support for the same twelve missionary families from prior years.

During the past year, many of the missionaries visited LCC and gave talks on their endeavors and progress in their missions (e.g., Robison, Okabe, and Carlsen). The works of these missionaries are shared through their monthly newsletters to our Missions Committee and through updates we report through our own church newsletter. In addition to financial support, congregation members are encouraged to participate remotely by becoming prayer partners. Partners are encouraged to pray for mission work throughout the year as each missionary is highlighted monthly on a rotating basis.

In addition to regular and direct support, the church has participated in other missions activities and events including:

- **Mission Trip to Baja, Mexico** Last August, in affiliation with Foundation for His Ministry (FFHM), Pastor John Foss led a group that participated in several construction and maintenance projects. We will continue to support FFHM with hands-on service when members from Pastor John's new church in Oregon join us for another trip in August 2019.
- **Wells of Life** Through special offerings, our congregation gave three fresh-water wells at \$6,000 each to be built in rural Uganda. Our American Heritage Girls troop will be raising money for another well in the future.
- Rummage Sale and Clothing Drive Proceeds were donated to help fire victims in northern California.

List from South County Outreach website. http://www.sco-oc.org/ **Village of Hope** - On the second Saturday of each month, a group of 6-10 volunteers from church help prepare and serve lunch for individuals and families staying at the Village of Hope (OC Rescue Mission) in Tustin. This hands-on Christian ministry helps people get back on their feet and into a life of serving the Lord. Praise God!

Senior Food Box Ministry - Non-perishable food boxes are given to about 80 low-income seniors each month at the LW campus. Community Action Partnership OC supplies the food boxes and volunteers from LCC, St. Nicholas and Laguna Country United Methodist hand the boxes out to the seniors. Praise the Lord for His faithfulness!

Senior Grocery Program - We are already into our second year of this ministry and the Lord is doing great things in and through it! We are currently serving approximately 150 households at our bi-weekly distributions. Not only do these people receive fresh food, they also receive prayer, Bibles in their own languages, coffee & donuts, and sometimes various items to assist seniors in daily life. The distributions continue to take place in the LW social hall and it's clear from both senior food ministries that the need continues to be great. Praise God for His great provision!

Bethesda Homes - This ministry continues to bless many Bethesda residents (and helpers) every Tuesday! Thanks to Pastor Ron and those who faithfully serve each week as they bless these dear people, whose simple trust and love for Jesus reminds us all that we need 'to become like little children...to enter the Kingdom of Heaven'. Matthew 18:3.

Fall Clothing Drive/Rummage Sale – A lot of the clothing received this year was sold at the church Rummage Sale to help benefit the victims of the California fires. Remaining clothing and other items not sold at the sale, were given to the Boy Scouts for their rummage sale to help benefit scouting programs. Adopt-A-Family – In 2018 we adopted 10 families in need through South County Outreach. At Thanksgiving, we provided food for them to prepare along with devotion books. At Christmas, gifts were given to the children and grocery cards to each family to help with the Christmas meal. Thanks to the many who blessed these families in a special way!

Operation Christmas Child – 690 shoe boxes were collected this year from both churches, schools, and the American Heritage Girls troop. Approximately 10.6 million boxes were collected worldwide and given to children around the globe, proclaiming the Gospel & Love of Jesus Christ to them and their communities. Since 1993, close to 169 million shoe boxes have been given in Jesus' Name to our hurting world. Praise God for His hand of mercy upon this ministry!

Our Father's Table (OFT) - Since October 2014, OFT has lifted over 170 people from south county streets into transitional housing and support. Besides financial support from our church, members and school families from both campuses have participated in a variety of ways, from knitting hats and scarves for Christmas, to encouragement notes from students, to providing peanut butter and jelly for OFT's weekly sandwich ministry, to participating in the OFT Christmas event. May we continue to help those who are experiencing homelessness find a home and hope in Jesus Christ!

Monthly Financial Support - The following ministries are supported on a monthly basis by LCC through Compassion Ministries: Bethesda Homes, Orange County Rescue Mission, Our Father's Table and Teen Challenge.

Special Thanks to all who participated in these life-giving ministries; giving generously of your time, talent and treasure, to help meet the needs of many people with the Love of Christ.

Council Treasurer Report Scott Berg

"The Lord will open to you his good treasury, the heavens, to give the rain to your land in its season and to bless all the work of your hands. And you shall lend to many nations, but you shall not borrow." —Deuteronomy 28:12.

This last year, we were blessed as a church with the resources to meet our budget and support the ministries of the church. The generosity of our members in their time, talents and treasures have been faithfully employed to support our activities as a church and reach out to others to spread the Good News of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Church Income and Expenses

While our overall income increased by more than 6%, our offering income actually decreased -8%. This shortfall in income was offset by and increase in Other Income of more than 150%. The primary driver of Other Income is one-time donations/bequest from LCC members. We are thankful and rejoice in these gifts!

Expenses were slightly lower than expected at -2%. Properties and facilities were higher than expected due to capital projects funded by gifts/donations. Pastoral and staff changes resulted in lower than expected salaries and benefits.

As such, the church profit for the year was \$203,000. However, without the \$285,000 of gifts/donations, the church would have had a loss of nearly -\$85,000.

Investing for the Future

A number of capital projects were completed in the current year and more will be needed as our facilities continue to age. Efforts to strengthen our ministries will also require additional funds. As such, a reserve has been included in the 2019-2020 budget to account for the expenses that exceed our current rate of giving. This reserve will be funded by a future gift which has been identified, but for which the final amount is not yet known.

Aliso Viejo Christian School and LCC Preschool

AVCS current year Fees and Other Income increased +5% and +9%, respectively. The increase was primarily driven by enrollment growth. Actual enrollment exceeded expectations by 19 students (nearly 15%). Future budgeting is conservatively based on current enrollment. Expenses were slightly higher (+3%), but in line with current year growth. Restructuring of IT services (external vs. internal) and adding teachers will increase expenses for the coming year, but are needed to support the school and its mission. Capital projects were completed during the current year, but additional capital projects are needed as facilities continue to age.

LCC Preschool total income increased +9%, primarily driven by the mix of full day/half day student enrollment. The increase in revenue was offset by added expenses which grew by 12% as additional resources were needed to support full day programs. Enrollment growth is expected to provide additional revenue in the future.

Strengthening Our Church

As a church, we have continued to maximize the resources available to us, and we have made great progress in strengthening our church. We have reliable financial statements, stronger processes that have positively impacted our financial position. But, there is more work to do! Capital needs will continue to be a focus in the future and additional debt reduction should be considered where possible to eliminate our outstanding burden more rapidly.

Special Thanks

I would like to thank the entire financial accounting team and Kevin Murphy, in particular, for all of their efforts. Their day-to-day diligence is greatly appreciated. I would also like to thank the church, school and committee leaders for their stewardship of the budgets entrusted to them.
